
Many of us know Tim, and knew his beloved wife, June. Time and June were together for 25 years, before her untimely passing due to cancer, nearly 6 years ago. Dr. June B. Craig was a most accomplished woman, with a Bachelor of Science undergraduate degree, a Master of Education degree, and a Ph. D. in Political Science, as well as always keeping her Registered Nurse License active. Dr. Craig held several upper-level management positions, including serving as the Director of Clinical and Nursing Informatics for two major hospital systems. Dr. Craig was a published writer, a distinguished speaker, a member of many professional organizations, and among her numerous awards, she was also honored in Strathmore's Who's Who.

Tim also has an extensive list of accomplishments. Tim served as a Non-Commissioned Officer in the United States Marine Corps, and later had the honor of working for three U.S. Presidents during his time in Washington D.C. In those positions, Tim managed a federal agency with a budget of \$200 Million, and he played a key role in the policy development for a national federal government Department with an annual budget of \$20 Billion, and over 200,000 employees. Tim was also the Director of a Presidential campaign for a large southern state.

But perhaps more important than those accomplishments, Tim has done many great things to move Keys Gate forward during his involvement with the Keys Gate Community Association. Tim was the first Delegate in his neighborhood of The Shores. He was also the first Chairman of the Delegates, elected to that position by his fellow early Delegates. Tim has been instrumental in developing policies on the functioning of the Delegates and has daily interactions with the Members of the Board of Directors of the Association. Tim is now the Representative of the Board of Directors, and the Community Liaison of the Keys Gate Community Association. In those roles, Tim has diligently, and consistently, worked for his fellow Keys Gate residents, and maintained an effective working relationship with our neighborhood Delegates, with the City of Homestead, with the City's Police Department, with AT&T and other Keys Gate vendors, and with representatives of Miami-Dade County.

Please join me in congratulating Tim and his late wife, June, on this Park dedication in their honor.

Fellow Towngaters,

Everybody in Town Gate 3 is well aware of the issues that we have been having for a very long time with the city drains. I am ECSTATIC to write that THE CITY HAS COME OUT AND REPAIRED THE ISSUE and it will be a problem no more!!! Thank you so much to Councilman Sean Fletcher for your assistance ... we are all so thankful and grateful!

Looks like we made it to June ... and the beginning of hurricane season! Our French drains have been cleaned and the tree trimming is ongoing for preparation as I write this. Everybody knows the drill ... make sure that you're prepared and you have a plan for you, your family, your pets, and your home... and let's enjoy our summer!

THE PARK AND POOL ARE READY FOR SUMMER FUN... are you? Here are a few things to remember: The pool is very hard and expensive to keep clean during things to remember. The pool is very hard and expensive to keep clean during the summer months with all the people using it. The pool is for Towngate and Arbor park residents only (Centergate residents pay into the RPC pool, and Palm Breeze has their own pools). Please do not open the gate of the pool for anyone if they do not have a key. If they do not have a key, they do not live in Towngate or Arbor Park, which means they are not allowed to use the pool unless they are a guest of someone who does. We pay for the pool in our monthly fees, and letting people who are not residents of Arbor Park or Towngate use our pool creates that much more usage, meaning more trash and more oiled up bodies clouding up the water, increasing our cost to keep it clean. If you come to the pool without a key please do not expect to be let in...and if you do security will be coming around periodically asking for resident pool keys, and if you do not have one you will be asked to leave. Please follow all the rules posted in the park and pool areas, for not only your safety but for the safety of others. Some residents may remind you of common sense rules that may not be listed, it is a community pool made up of a community of hard working people that are looking to use our pool as a getaway/ therapy so let's please respect each other. If you are planning a party in one of the tiki pavilions, plan to stay with the pavilion until your party is over. As it stands these areas are not regulated as that would cost US money, so If you are going to use the tiki have someone stay with the tiki at all times, and please clean up after your party. Something like placing a table cloth or hanging ballons and leaving is not cool and could create an unnecessary issue, and do not leave your garbage bags in the park either - bag your garbage and take it back to your house and leave it clean for the next round of residents. Maintenance crews do not work on weekends, and accumulated garbage will attract rodents, create a very dirty stinky mess, and are an eyesore. Security has been instructed to stop by and ask who is having parties so that we will know who is responsible for keeping that area of the park clean. Signs are posted with all of these rules and could result in a violation issued to that homeowner if not followed. Please also be aware of noise that is not associated with a respectful party: loud music and adults screaming will most likely require a visit from security.

You will notice that there was an article about trash this month it is really important that we keep our community clean - especially those areas. Make sure that when you bring your garbage out it goes in the dumpster. Make sure when you open the dumpster you close it after you put your trash in. Make sure that you do not put your bulk trash out until the day before it is due. These things are simple - and very important in keeping our neighborhood clean and looking spiffy.

Sometimes we complain about our neighbors, but have we thought that maybe we are the ones who annoy them for not being good neighbors and friends?


A good neighbor always:

This month we are discussing our Homeowners Fees. There are two main categories of expenses that Keys Gate budgets for on a yearly basis.

The first are **OPERATING EXPENSES**: these allow the association to run its day-to-day and month-to-month services, contracts, and maintenance operations. They are broken down and listed on the yearly budget which is mailed every year to all homeowners. Below is a sample list of some of the yearly budget's line items that our fees cover.

- Cable/Internet Service
- Community Newsletter & Website
- Printing/Postage/Office Supplies
- Onsite Management Office Expense

The second category of expenses are **RESERVES.** Reserves are collected and placed in an account to be used for expenses that are not needed every year or for long term expenses, including paving, roof replacement and pool restoration etc. The list is lengthy and complicated - we have a lot of moving parts to monitor and maintain here in Keys Gate.


Every month a portion of your maintenance fees goes into a savings account to fund these future reserve expenses. Below is a list of some reserve items that are fundamental to the Keys Gate community and it's future.

# TRASH TALKING IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD

In January of this year, bulk trash and recycling pick-up days changed to alternating biweekly schedules. We all have had enough time to get used to the changes; however, some residents are not complying and they contiue to place bulk trash out in some cases over a week prior to pick up.

No one wants to see their neighborhoods trashed, and we all need to do our part to keep Keys Gate pristine. It is an eyesore seeing bulk trash sit out of days. Besides the ugliness, there are safety and health concern.

Homestead Code Compliance is out in force, and property owners receive fines. Avoid getting fines by following the rules.

Below is information from the Keys Gate rules and regulations and the City of Homestead website concerning sanitation:

Keys Gate: Garbage and Trash Containers and Disposal. No Lot shall be used or maintained by an Owner as a dumping ground for rubbish, trash or other waste. No garbage, refuse, trash, or rubbish shall be disposed of except as specified by the local regulations. The ordinances of local governmental authority shall be followed. All trash, garbage and other waste shall be kept in clean, sanitary containers and, except during pickup if required to be placed at the curb, all containers shall be kept within an enclosed garage, storage room or out of public view. Storage on the side of the Residence or under foliage is prohibited unless written approval of the Architectural Control Committee (the "Committee") is obtained. The Committee may consider allowing storage of garbage and recycling containers on the side of the Residence, or a portion of the building, if said containers are shielded from street view and neighbor's view by hedge material. North Gate, Townhomes and Condominium units must store their trash and recycling containers within an enclosed garage, storage room or out of public view. Under no circumstances shall any trash, garbage or other waste be placed outside the dumpster or container. This does not apply to bulk debris which can be placed per city guidelines. Garbage cans, recycling cans, and bulky waste piles must be placed at the curb no earlier than 6:00pm the evening before collection and not later than 4:00am the day of collection. All cans must be removed from the curb by 8:00pm on the day of collection. At no time should landscape materials be deposited in with the regular garbage. A weekly pick up of disposal landscape materials will be scheduled. No building waste or other material of any kind, including grass clippings, shall be dumped or stored within Keys Gate except the Declarant may temporarily store clean earth for the purpose of grading in connection with the erection of a building thereon or for the immediate improvement of the grounds. All large items shall be disposed of at the city dump.

**City of Homestead Sanitation:** Placing Your Cans & Bulky Waste Piles: On collection days, wheel your container to curbside for collection with the handle facing your home. Garbage cans, recycling cans, and bulky waste piles must be placed at the curb no earlier than 6:00pm the evening before collection and not later than 4:00am the day of collection. All cans must be removed from the curb by 8:00pm on the day of collection.

Garbage cans, recycling cans, and bulky waste piles must be place at least five feet apart from one another and must be clear from obstacles like bulk waste piles, mailboxes, trees, and cars.

**Supercans:** Each home receives a Supercan with a green lid to dispose of general household waste. The following materials should not be placed in the Supercan: dirt, sod, liquids, rocks, concrete, paints, toxic or flammable materials, construction debris, dead animals, roofing materials, leaves, grass, clippings, branches, metal, or wood.

Certain chemicals and materials such as paints, acids, and propane tanks must be disposed of specially at a Home Chemical Collection Center.

**Recycling:** Each home receives a Recycling Can with a yellow or gray lid. HPS offers single-stream recycling, so you don't have to separate different types of recyclables. HPS accepts, plastics, cardboard, paper, glass, aluminum, and steel. All recyclables should be clean and empty. Containers should be rinsed and free of food waste. Cardboard items should be dry.

**Bulky Waste Pickup:** Large bulky items and yard waste should be placed at the edge of the street on your property one day prior to the scheduled pickup date and no more than 10 cubic yards. Bulk must be place at least five feet from any obstacles like mailboxes, trees, and cars.

Appliances HPS can collect include stoves, refrigerators, freezers, washing machines, dryers, and water heaters. Doors must be removed from refrigerators and freezers.

Yard waste includes grass, leaves, trees, and shrubbery cuttings. Tree limbs and logs must be less than four inches in diameter and stumps must be less than fifteen inches in diameter and less than fifty pounds in weight.

The following items MUST NOT be included in Bulky Waste Pickups: dirt, sod, liquids, rocks, concrete, paints, toxic or flammable materials, construction debris, tires, dead animals, or roofing materials.

In their never-ending pursuit of your money and identity, criminals are constantly coming up with new cons. Here's a closer look at eight relatively new types of scams that are becoming more common, along with expert advice on avoiding them. Check out the list of today's hottest emerging frauds.

**1. Google Voice Scam:** Let's say you've posted a notice online — an item for sale, for example, or a plea to find a lost pet — and included your phone number. In this scam the crook will call you, feign interest, but say they want to verify first that you aren't a scammer. They tell you that you are about to get a verification code from Google Voice (their virtual phone and text service) sent to you, and ask you to read it back. What's really going on: They are setting up a Google Voice account in your name. "They can go on to perpetrate scams and pretend to be you, hiding their footprint from law enforcement," says Eva Velasquez, CEO of the Identity Theft Resource Center.

**How to stay safe:** "Never share verification codes with anyone," Velasquez says. If you have fallen for this scam, you'll find steps to reclaim your account at the Google Voice Help Center.

**2. Rental Assistance Cons:** As eviction bans in cities and states expire, renters should be on the lookout for rental assistance scams, says Deborah Royster, assistant director at the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau. Over 583,000 older adults were behind on their rent in mid-2021, opening the door for scammers to impersonate government or nonprofit employees and to request personal info and money up front for applications.

**How to stay safe:** Apply only to legit rental assistance programs run by government or nonprofit groups, Royster says. Find programs in your area at cfpb.gov.

**3. Fake-Job Frauds:** Scammers harvest contact info and personal details from résumés posted on legit job websites like Indeed, Monster and CareerBuilder. Then, pretending to be recruiters, they call, email, text or reach out on social media with high-salary or work-at-home job offers. Sometimes the goal is to get additional info about you; other times it's to persuade you to send money for bogus home-office setups or fake fees.

**How to stay safe:** Use a separate email address just for job hunting, and set up a free Google Voice phone number that rings on your phone but keeps your real number private, says Alex Hamerstone, advisory solutions director for the information security company TrustedSec. If you get a sudden job offer, independently call the company's human resources department to verify it is real, suggests Sandra Guile, spokeswoman for the International Association of Better Business Bureaus.

**4. Fake Amazon Employees:** One-third of business-impostor fraud complaints involve scammers claiming they're from Amazon, the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) reports. Older adults are four times more likely to lose money and get hit harder — losing a median of \$1,500, versus \$814 for younger adults — in such scams. "Amazon is the biggest, best-known company in the [online sales] space," Hamerstone says. So the impersonator scams "feel real" to people.

**How to stay safe:** Ignore calls, text messages, emails and social media messages about suspicious account activity, raffles or unauthorized purchases. If you think you may have a real account problem, contact Amazon customer support at 888-280-4331.

**5. Cryptocurrency ATM Payments:** Those ATMs cropping up in convenience stores, gas stations and big retailers are scammers' newest payment method. Pretending to be government officials, utility agents or sweepstakes representatives, they direct you to pay a purported fee, bill or handling charge by sending cryptocurrency bought at these ATMs to an untraceable digital wallet. "It's irreversible. There's no way to get your money back," says Lisa Cialino, an attorney with the New Jersey State Commission of Investigation.

**How to stay safe:** According to the FTC, "nobody from the government, law enforcement, a utility company or prize promoter will ever tell you to pay them with cryptocurrency. If someone does, it's a scam, every time."

**6. Local Tax Impostors:** Scammers are impersonating state, county and municipal law enforcement and tax collection agencies to get you to share sensitive personal information or send money to "settle your tax debt." They may call, email or mail letters threatening to revoke your driver's license or passport. Some pretend to offer state tax relief.

**How to stay safe:** Ignore any such calls and emails. Real tax agencies, from the IRS to your town tax collector, do business by mail and won't ask you for passwords or bank account or credit card info. They also won't threaten to call the police or ask you to pay with gift cards, peer-to-peer (P2P) payment apps or cryptocurrency.


**7. 'Favor for a Friend' Gift Cards**: You receive an email from a friend asking for a quick favor. She's having trouble with a credit card or store account and, annoyingly, can't buy a gift card she needs for a birthday present. Will you buy the card and call her with the numbers on the back? She'll pay you back. But this favor's really a fraud, as it's almost always an impostor sending the request, the Better Business Bureau (BBB) warns. If you do as told, you'll never see the money again because gift cards don't have the protections that debit and credit cards have.

**How to stay safe:** Call or text your friend to confirm the person really needs the favor. Target, Google Play, Apple, eBay and Walmart were the top cards used by scammers in 2021. "Always double check before sending someone money," the BBB advises.

**8. P2P Payment Requests:** Scammers are increasingly demanding payment via money-transfer apps like Venmo, Zelle and Cash App. It's so convenient — you pay in seconds from your phone or computer. But these payments usually cannot be canceled.

**How to stay safe:** Only use P2P apps to send money to friends and family. And turn on the security-lock feature that requires entering a passcode to make a payment.


